<p>Amendment 1:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Freedom of religion (Establishment & Free Exercise Clauses) -Freedom of speech -Freedom of press -Freedom of assembly -Right to petition 	<p>Amendment 7:</p> <p>Right to jury in civil trials</p>
<p>Amendment 2:</p> <p>Right to a militia/bear arms</p>	<p>Amendment 8:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Protection against excessive fines and bail -Protection against cruel and unusual punishment
<p>Amendment 3:</p> <p>Protection against quartering of soldiers (privacy?)</p>	<p>Amendment 9:</p> <p>Above rights are not a complete list; the people retain many more rights (privacy?)</p>
<p>Amendment 4:</p> <p>Protection against unreasonable searches and seizures (warrants obtained through probable cause) (privacy?)</p>	<p>Amendment 10:</p> <p>Powers not granted in the Constitution are reserved for the states (states' rights?)</p>
<p>Amendment 5:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Right to a grand jury -Protection against double jeopardy -Protection against self-incrimination -Guarantee of "due process of law" 	<p>Amendment 14:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -All born in the United States are citizens -No state can deprive citizens of equal protection of the laws -No state can deprive citizens of due process of law -Privileges and immunities of citizens are protected in all states
<p>Amendment 6:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Right to jury trial in criminal prosecutions -Right to confront witnesses and have witnesses on own behalf -Right to counsel (lawyer)
